It was great to see so many parents out for Back-To-School Night – we had record attendance at our General Parent Meeting! At Bishop, we hold true that parents are the primary educators of their children. Thank you to the Parent Advisory Board for coordinating the General Parent Meeting that preceded the classroom visits!

October is a fun month on campus - I invite you to attend the many exciting activities during Spirit Week, 2011 as we travel to 4 destinations throughout the world! Spirit Week, 2011 will culminate on Friday the 14th with the lip syncs and skits performed by each class. We also welcome approximately 100 prospective freshmen from our partner school eighth grades. The evening festivities include the Homecoming football game at SBCC and the presentation of the Homecoming King and Queen at half-time. All are welcome!

Published in this newsletter is a summary of our 2011-2012 operating budget for your review. Bishop High is committed to providing financial assistance to families who qualify with a demonstrated need. Approximately 60% of our students receive some level of school-funded financial aid totaling more than \$900,000. This represents 21% of our operating budget.

The school subsidizes every student \$1,364.00 above the tuition rate to balance the budget. We request that every parent help defray this subsidy by selling or purchasing two Cardinal Event raffle tickets, participate in the Annual Fund, and assist in some capacity with our Gala Auction in March. We thank you in advance for doing your very best to support our fall and spring fundraisers.

As we move toward the end of the first quarter, please be vigilant with monitoring your child's progress on Edline. The teachers are doing a wonderful job of updating grades every Friday for you to review. Please be sure to contact your child's teacher with any questions pertaining to his/her academic progress in respective classes.

A reminder about the Academic Policy regarding student athletes. Students who participate in our sports programs are required to submit assignments to their

teachers prior to leaving for an athletic contest. As part of our school's mission, self-reliance is a key skill we are supporting our students in which to grow. Please ensure that, if your son or daughter is a student athlete at any level, they are submitting their assignments to their teachers prior to leaving for an athletic contest. Should they miss a quiz or an exam, they are required to work with their teacher on a make-up date for the quiz or exam within 48 hours of returning to class.

By State law, we cannot permit students without the booster to attend school after September 30th until the booster has been administered. Spirit Week is fast approaching and while it is a fun and important event for students, it also provides ample opportunities for distraction from studies. Please monitor your student's study habits especially closely this month by checking Edline for assignments and ensuring he or she is completing work on time.

Here's a round-up of some of the great things that have been happening in the Sciences program.

In Intro to Programming, we are writing small Python programs to do numerical computations and string manipulation. Programming is time-consuming, but addictive! And, we can count in binary!

In Mathematical Applications, seniors are mastering the intricacies of logic, the basic rules of rational thought. Similarly, Geometry and Honors Geometry students are writing Geometric and Algebraic proofs. Students are asked to logically organize their thoughts, using a two-column approach, and justify each step with one of the many postulates, properties, and theorems that they have learned.

Santa Barbara is replete with cultural and educational opportunities for teenagers. Encourage your child to attend one of the UCSB Arts and Lecture events (artsandlectures.sa.ucsb.edu), visit the S.B. Museum of Art (sbmuseart.org), or see a show at the Granada (granadasb.org). These experiences greatly increase personal and intellectual growth. Take

In Honors Pre-Calculus, we are looking at modeling real world situations with linear and quadratic functions. Similarly, in Algebra 2, we are looking at data trends by graphing Scatter Plots and finding the equation of the best fit line. In Algebra 1, we are just beginning our work with Linear Equations, building the foundation for our next three years of Mathematics! Calculus students have just encountered one of the two main pillars of the subject: the derivative.

Mu Alpha Theta (the mathematics honors society) has started up its tutoring service project for grades 3-8. We assist students with their current math school work. Students may drop in at any time, without appointment, during tutoring hours. They should bring their homework. When students sign in the first

Academics:

We are grateful to our hard working teachers for updating Edline on a weekly basis. This is no easy task, and we hope families have found the information useful. Should you have a question about your student's progress in a particular class, please reach out to the teacher as a first course of action. If you find that additional support is needed, contact your Academic and College Counselor for assistance.

Students with a GPA of 3.75 or higher and demonstrated leadership on campus are encouraged to apply for the National Honor Society (NHS). Applications are available in the College Counseling Center and are due no later than October 3.

Students enrolled in AP courses are required to commit to and pay for the exam no later than October 6. Those who miss the October 6 deadline will be removed from the AP course for the remainder of the year.

Support Services:

Bishop Peer Tutoring will be available after October 17. Cal-SOAP college tutoring will be up and running in November. If you are interested in free tutoring assistance for your student, please have him/her sign up in the College Counseling Center.

November 5, 2011 SAT Test: The deadline to register for this test is October 7, 2011. You can register at www.collegeboard.com. Our school code is 053-245.

December 10, 2011 ACT Test: The deadline to register for this test is November 4, 2011. You can register at www.actstudent.org.

We have gone into the

senior classrooms to provide students with college admissions updates and information. Please ask your student to share this information with you. If you are interested in an individual college counseling appointment, please contact your Academic and College Counselor to set up a time.

We have advised seniors of the process for requesting letters of recommendation (for private college admissions and scholarships). We require two weeks' notice in order to complete a letter or recommendation or secondary school report. The same is required for our teachers. Many private school admission deadlines fall in January. Please do not wait to submit your requests until mid-December, as we will not be writing letters over Christmas vacation. Most private colleges utilize www.commonapp.org for the application process. Students should submit letter of recommendation requests through the Common App website. In the rare circumstance that a college only accepts paper versions of letters of recommendation, we will take these requests from students. Be sure to include a pre-stamped envelope, addressed to the college, with a return address of BGDHS, 4000 La Colina, Santa Barbara, CA 93110. Letters will be mailed directly to colleges upon completion.

Bishop will hold a series of college workshops designed to support students with the college admissions process. The California State University workshop will be held on October 5th. The University of California Workshop will be held on October 18th. The Common Application workshop will be held on October 24th. All college workshops will take place in the library computer lab during lunchtime. Students must sign up for the workshops in advance with their Counselor.

General College Counseling News

All 9th, 10th and 11th grade students will take the PSAT (Practice SAT) on October 12. This is an excellent opportunity to practice for the SAT college admissions exam, as well as, an opportunity to assess skills attained and areas needed for growth.

Bishop recommends that students take the SATs in May or June of 11th grade. SAT II exams should be taken immediately upon completion of the corresponding course.

The 2011 College Fair will take place on November 2nd from 6:00pm - 8:00pm, at Earl Warren Showgrounds. Students and parents will have the opportunity to meet with representatives from 80 Colleges and Universities from around the nation, including the University of California and the California State University campuses. Trained Financial Aid professionals will be available to teach you how to apply for and secure scholarships, grants (federal and state aid), and loans for education. The College Fair will take place in Warren Hall: 3400 Calle Real, off Las Positas Road.

Scholarship Opportunities:

The Santa Barbara Scholarship Foundation is offering the following opportunities:

- Honors Scholarship Program for high school seniors, with a minimum 4.2 GPA.
- Art Scholarship Program for high school seniors planning to major in art

or an art related field in college.

- Fleischmann and Floro Awards for high school seniors who have demonstrated an outstanding commitment to community service and have a 3.5 GPA.
- The Creative Writing Scholarship for high school seniors who have demonstrated unusual aptitude or potential in the field of creative writing or poetry.

The deadline to apply for these scholarships is November 1, 2011. Financial need is not required. Applications are available at www.sbscholarship.org.

The Dreamer's Challenge Scholarship is offering a \$5,000 scholarship available to high school seniors. The deadline to apply is October 15, 2011. For more information visit www.dreamerschallenge.org.

Ladies Dress Code:

Ms. Carr and Mrs. Adam met with all of the girls regarding dress code.

The ladies have so many fashionable options to choose from each day, and we want to ensure that their choices demonstrate Christian modesty, represent BDHS in a positive way, and allow them to express their individuality in a meaningful and appropriate way. The dress code policy is stated in the Parent-Student Handbook on page 50. Our message to the ladies today was:

- No leggings, except under a skirt or dress, which must be of appropriate dress code length.
- Do the "arms up" test to check if your shirt length is okay.
- Shirts should not ride up to show skin or the abdomen, and should not be too low-cut. Wear an undershirt that goes below the top of your pants or skirt.
- No T-Shirts (except BDHS T-Shirts)! Nice shirts and sweaters are appropriate, but t-shirts are too casual.

If you are questioning whether it is dress-code appropriate, then it is best

not to wear it at all.

We appreciate your cooperation in this matter; we want our students to have the privilege of the current dress-code. We don't want to have to enforce a stricter dress code due to dress-code violations that really can be avoided.

Tardy Report:

1. Tardies this time of year last year were:
 - a. 90 students with tardies
 - b. 154 total tardies assigned
2. Tardies at present for this year:
 - a. 60 students with tardies
 - b. 82 tardies assigned (a reduction in 72 tardies)

Tardy Policy:

- Three (3) tardies will result in Morning Detail.
- Six (6) tardies will result in Morning Detail and parent conference with Dean of Men and Women and student.
- Ten (10) tardies will result in a Morning Detail, parent conference with Dean of Men and Women, Assistant Head of School and student, and may result in an immediate discipline contract.

Morning Detail:

The school no longer issues lunch detention instead Morning Detail will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:00am-7:40am with the Deans. Students may get assigned to Morning Detail for dress code violations, tardies or other offenses as determined by the Dean of Men or Women. Typically, the work required includes maintenance of the school buildings or grounds. Any student who fails to report to Morning Detail or is late to Morning Detail will automatically receive an additional day of Morning Detail. Medical appointments, personal appointments, traffic on the freeway (unless there is an accident that is verified by the Attendance Secretary through the CHP), work, or co-curricular activities are not excusable reasons for missing Morning Detail. Students will be informed by the Deans that they have been assigned to Morning Detail.
