## Dr. Paul Harrington, Head of School

Welcome to a new and exciting school year at Bishop Garcia Diego High School! We are delighted to meet our seventy two freshman and ten transfer students as we also welcome our returning students for an opening enrollment of 287.

We welcome some new faces to the faculty and staff as well. Ms. Shannon Carpenter joins our Science Department, replacing Dr. Randy Hahn, who retired at the end of the school year. Shannon has a B.S. in Aquatic Biology from UCSB, an M.Ed. in Education from UCSB, and is credentialed in Biology. Shannon most recently taught at La Colina Junior High School, and was a Curatorial Assistant at the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History. Mrs. Rya Carpenter (no relation to Shannon) joins our Counseling Office as the Dean of Counseling and Student Services. Her undergrad degree is in Recreation Administration from San Diego State; she has her Pupil Personnel Services (P.P.S.) credential and earned her Master's in Counseling and Guidance from Cal Lutheran. Rya has perfected her craft at Vandenberg Middle School, and with the Saddleback Unified High School District in Mission Viejo. Ms. Holly Bassuk will teach our new dance class. With credentials in PE, Health Education, and English, Holly is a seasoned professional dancer and has performed in Tiger Lily on Broadway and the Wizard of Oz at Radio City Music Hall and traveled on the national tour for Peter Pan. Ms. Jhenna Shelton returns to Bishop to teach English. Jhenna taught English at Bishop from 2001-2004. She left BDHS to return to

school to complete her credential and has recently taught at Cabrillo and Lompoc High Schools. This year, there is a need for Mr. Ray Vazquez to teach a full-load of five classes in the areas of PE, math, and history. As a result, we are piloting a new model for Student Services, specifically in the area of student discipline. We welcome Ms. Stacey Carr as Dean of Women and Mr. Jason Donnelly as Dean of Men. Working collaboratively with the Counseling Program, Stacey and Jason will work with all students on behavioral matters.

Once again, generous benefactors who believe in the mission of our school helped to fund our many summer projects. These projects included a new exit in the front parking lot, new trees and landscape in the front of the school and parking area, a refreshed lobby, a new admissions welcome center for prospective students and families, a redesigned counseling center, and a tiled Prayer for Peace mounted in stone outside the practice gym. We've also moved a handful of classrooms and offices to better serve students and parents. Further, we have begun work on a dedicated space for Campus Ministry as well as an expanded technology center. These two projects should be completed over the course of the year. Fifty two years of progress and excellence continues at Bishop High with appreciation and gratitude to our many benefactors.

Parents are always welcome to any school event held during the school day. This includes Adoration in our chapel (8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Wednesday). Visitors do need to sign in at the front office and wear a visitor badge. This month we will gather several times to get to know each other better to ensure a quality-learning program for our students. All parents and guardians are expected to attend the General Parent meeting at 5:30 p.m. and Back-To-School Night at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, September 14.

Thank you for your patience with our new one-way drop off and pick up. There is already a remarkable improvement in speed and safety in the morning and afternoon. Parents and students are asked to please keep the morning drop off line moving quickly and carefully. Please pull to the curb for drop off only. Do not drop off in the moving lanes. The driveway entrance is wide enough for two lanes of entering traffic. Further, please do not pull in and drop off immediately at the driveway entrance. This causes increased congestion for incoming traffic. We request that all vehicles parked on the school grounds during the school day be registered through the Attendance Office. There is a \$2.00 charge for this registration and assigned parking permit. A numbered decal needs to be visible by hanging it on the rearview

mirror. Families may register multiple vehicles and the registration simply includes the make, color, vehicle license plate and the driver's name.

It is important to know that the actual cost of education at Bishop Garcia Diego High School is approximately \$15,500 for each student. Our tuition rate of \$13,950 is well below the operational costs of the school and far less than local private secondary schools. We make every effort to offer financial aid to families who cannot afford the full cost of a Bishop High education. Our benefactors willingly provided us with campus improvements and invest in the approximately 60% of our students on financial assistance. Please do your best to support the school fundraising activities that help make up the difference in the tuition rate and the actual cost of educating each child. Our fall fundraiser, the Cardinal Event, supports our athletic department and parent board activities and includes a raffle for a \$20,000 cash grand prize among many additional cash prizes. This year, we have a special opportunity for families who sell five additional raffle tickets (beyond the required 2) for free 2012-2013 tuition. Our fall appeal through December 31, 2012 is the Annual Fund that helps fill the tuition gap mentioned above. Lastly, and often said to be the most fun, is our Annual Auction Gala on the first Saturday in March. This themed event raises necessary funds for our Adopt-A-Student program to assist the 60% of our families who need financial aid.

Finally, parents please speak with your child about personal responsibility and respect for their schoolmates as well as care for the school campus. Whether through our campus

ministry program, the arts, athletics, Parent Board, Cardinal Club, and other great opportunities, please get involved in our school – your school! Know that you are in my thoughts and prayers and I ask that you remember all of us here at school in your daily prayers.

## Assistant Head of School Dr. Joe Reiken

Welcome back! School is off to a wonderful start and the students seem refreshed and energized! Welcome week was a blast and the lip syncs were entertaining, as always. I encourage you to visit the campus and see the positive energy for yourself!

Please note two changes to our grade reporting for this academic year.

1. Edline will be updated with grades weekly, rather than every two weeks.
2. There is a new score in the gradebook that informs you about the extent to which your child is exhibiting Learning Behaviors that are commonly associated with high achievement. Please note that this mark does not affect the academic grade and is intended to a communication to you, the counselors and the student. The Learning Behaviors rubric can be found on the front page of Edline and

on teachers' individual Edline pages. Teachers will notify you should your child be issued an "N" or a "U" for the week.

Thank you for all you are doing as parents to support your child's education at Bishop High School.

I want to take a moment and explain the communication policy within the school organization. I have provided the step-by-step process for going about communicating with School employees, in particular about concerns within particular classrooms. The process is outlined as follows:

1. Contact the classroom teacher
2. Contact the appropriate Academic Dean
  - a. Ms. Mandy Combs, Dean of Humanities (English, world languages, history, visual and performing arts)
  - b. Sister Helen Wolkerstorfer,

- c. Mrs. Brianna Adam, Dean of Sciences (science, mathematics, technology, physical education/health)
  - d. Mrs. Rya Carpenter, Dean of Counseling and Student Services (counseling, personal counseling, resource)
3. Contact the Assistant Head of School
  4. Contact the Head of School

Following this process will ensure a prompt and equitable solution to any concerns you may have.

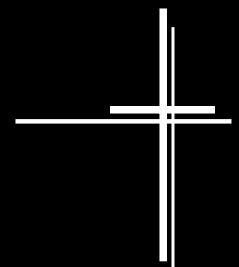
Bishop's annual tuition is \$13,950, but it costs more than \$15,500 to educate every

### College Bound Cardinals, Class of 2012

Last spring Mrs. Hornbuckle had the opportunity to meet with all seniors regarding their college plans. If you and your child have additional questions or concerns regarding college planning, please feel free to make an appointment with your Counselor.

Bishop will hold a series of college workshops designed to support students with the college admissions process. The California State University workshop will be held on October 5th. The University of California Workshop will be held on October 18th. The Common Application workshop will be held on October 24th. All college workshops will take in the library computer lab during lunch time. Students must sign up for the workshops in advance with their Counselor.

In addition to these workshops, the Academic and College Counselors will visit senior classrooms to provide updates

on the college admissions process (i.e. transcript review, letters of recommendation, application reminders and financial aid). In October, please ask your student for updates shared in class.

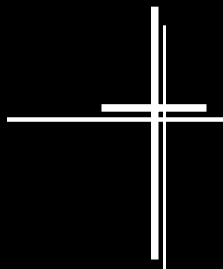

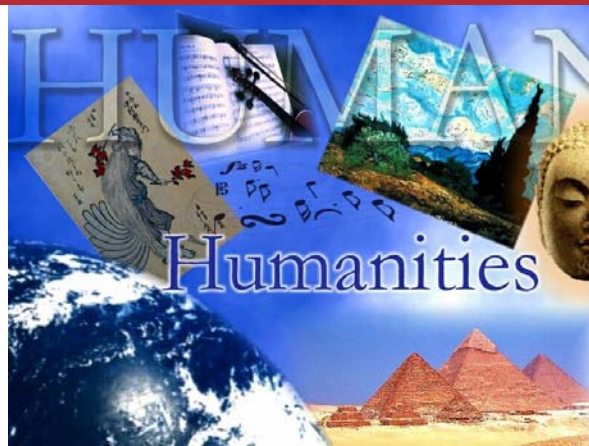

Again, this does not impact their grade. Behaviors reflected in this "score" include coming to class prepared, level of disruption or contribution, citizenship, etc. Teachers will contact you when your student falls below a satisfactory level in this area. If you have further questions about this, contact a counselor or academic dean. Finally, on behalf of all of the Humanities

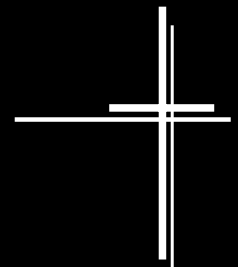

Welcome to another amazing year at BDHS! We send a warm welcome to our new Cardinal Parents and Students. New to the Sciences Department this year, we would like to introduce Ms. Shannon Carpenter who will be teaching Biology and Anatomy. Also, some familiar faces have joined us: Mr. Ray Vazquez will be teaching Algebra I, along with P.E. and Health, and Dr. Paul Harrington will be teaching Honors Geometry.

Many of the Math classes participated in the CSU/UC Mathematics Diagnostic Testing Project (MDTP), as an initial assessment of what students have retained from their previous Math courses. The MDTP tests are designed to measure student readiness for a broad range of mathematics courses. More importantly, the tests were developed to provide students and teachers with diagnostic information about student preparedness. This information can help students identify specific areas where additional study or review is needed, and it can help teachers identify topics and skills that need more attention in courses. In a few weeks, results from the MDTP will be sent back to BDHS and

distributed to students. Each student will receive a letter that indicates the student's score and identifies those topics in which more work is needed.

In the Science classes, we are gearing up for an exciting year in the lab where students will get to experience the world of Science through hands-on exploration. Over the summer we brought in new Vernier science lab equipment, which allows for a dynamic approach to teaching the Sciences. Vernier puts easy-to-use data loggers, sensors, experiments and graphing/analysis software into the hands of students, and brings Science to life in the real world. If you have not visited our new Science Wing, we invite you to stop by and see all that the BDHS Science classes have to offer!

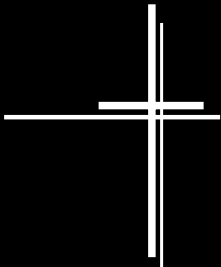

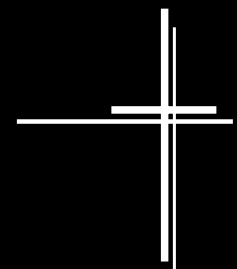

## Deans of Men and Women Mr. Jason Donnelly and Ms. Stacey Carr

### **New Parking Lot:**

We are very excited about the new exit driveway, what a great addition to the school. We thank **Lash Construction** for making this new exit possible. If you are dropping off your son/daughter please pull to the curb, not the middle of the road, this will help the traffic flow.

Please be conscientious of the time and if there are highway repairs that could delay your arrival to school. If you are heading north, the highway exits between Salinas and Milpas do get backed up due to construction. Next week many of the public high schools will begin, traffic may increase. **Keep in mind, first period tardies are unexcused.** Students need to be at school in class by 7:50am. In addition students are not allowed to park in the back parking lot, this is reserved for faculty and staff.

### **Morning Detail:**

The school no longer issues lunch detention instead Morning Detail will be held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:00am-7:40am with the Deans. Students may get assigned to Morning Detail for dress code violations, tardies or other offenses as determined by the Dean of Men or Women. Typically, the work

required includes maintenance of the school buildings or grounds. Any student who fails to report to Morning Detail or is late to Morning Detail will automatically receive an additional day of Morning Detail. Medical appointments, personal appointments, traffic on the freeway (unless there is an accident that is verified by the Attendance Secretary through the CHP), work, or co-curricular activities are not excusable reasons for missing Morning Detail. Students will be informed by the Deans that they have been assigned to Morning Detail.

### **Tardies:**

- Three (3) tardies will result in Morning Detail.

- Six (6) tardies will result in Morning Detail and parent conference with Dean of Men and Women and student.

- Ten (10) tardies will result in a Morning Detail, parent conference with Dean of Men and Women, Assistant Head of School and student, and may result in an immediate discipline contract.

### **Parking Permits:**

All students driving themselves to school need a parking permit from Mrs. McCarthy. The cost is \$2.00 and is required for all students who park on campus.

The parking permit must be displayed at all times; cars may be towed if there is no permit. Students must have a parking permit by Friday, September 16th.

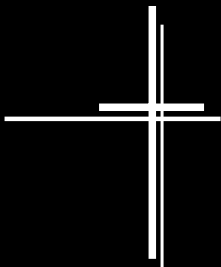
### **Cold Season:**

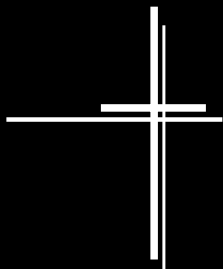

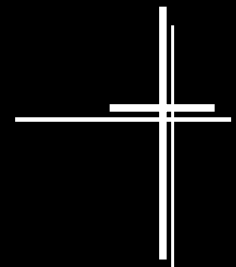

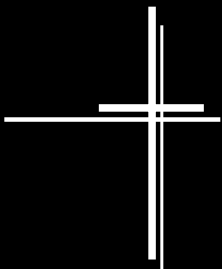
provide them with the supplies they need to help women deliver their babies safely.

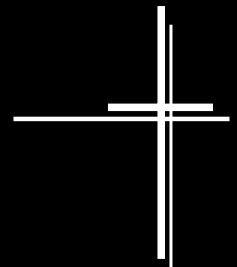
