The season of Advent began on Sunday, November 27th. On Monday the 28th, we had a very special blessing of our school's advent wreath that included a fun skit with John the Baptist and Santa Claus!

The end of the semester is quickly approaching, and final exams will be upon us in no time. Make sure you check in with your teachers about getting extra help in preparing for finals. On Edline, you can use the Final Grade Calculator on the Mu Alpha Theta page to gauge how your performance on your final will impact your overall semester grade. Check it out!

Here is an update on what has been happening in the realm of the Sciences:

At the start of the month, we kicked off November with the Science Spectacular. Dr. Kelly, Dr. Hahn, and Ms. Carpenter put on a show of the wonders of Science, with some truly spectacular demonstrations.

Also in early November, 50 BDHS students participated in Imagine Math Day at Westmont College. Students worked on a series of problems that dealt with graph and network theory, a higher level of Mathematics that is usually taught in college!

In Computer Applications, students just presented

PowerPoint projects on an animal of their choice. Students incorporated pictures, video clips, sounds, and animations into their presentations. They have started a new project where they are tracking a portfolio of stocks, and creating reports of their portfolio activity.

In Animation Design, students have been working on 3D outer space and Haunted House animations that have been shown every day at the start of BDTV.

In Algebra I, students have been mastering linear equations in various forms. Students worked on "The Big Race," a project where linear equations were used to see who won The Big Race, an example of a real world application of linear equations.

In Algebra II, students have been conquering Quadratic Functions, and will soon be moving onto Polynomial Functions. These types of functions are commonly seen in real world applications of physics.

In Biology, we are currently growing Brassica rapa

plants, commonly referred to as fast plants for their quick life cycle. This serves as an introduction to our genetics unit. We will be cross-pollinating plants with different traits to observe dominant and recessive traits. Happy pollinating!

In Anatomy & Physiology, students have been learning the major muscle groups, and the process for muscle contraction. We are getting ready for the cat dissection, which is a GREAT learning experience. Every student participates, and really gets an understanding of how bodies work.

With the Christmas vacation fast approaching, it is a busy and exciting time of year. For your children, it is really crunch time. Final exams will take place December 14 – 16. These exams cover material from the entire first semester and count for up to 20% of the semester grade. Students must do well to keep their grade up or to improve the grade they already have. Please encourage your student to begin studying NOW and not to wait. Some students may want to check with their teachers soon to make sure they understand what is expected of them. Often freshmen find these first finals intimidating and wish they had put more effort into preparing. Should your child need help with study tips or test preparation, have him/her consult with an academic counselor.

As a reminder, we have free peer tutoring available to students in the Library from 3:15pm-4:00pm, Monday-Thursday. However, tutoring will not be offered the week of finals.

A Bishop student has requested a tutor who is fluent in Japanese. We are researching options for this student, but if you know of someone who might be available to help, please contact Mrs. Carpenter at 805.967.1266 ext. 121. Your support is appreciated.

In January, with the start of second semester, we will be working on necessary schedule changes. **Most**

courses are yearlong, so there will not be a lot of changes. Students who fail a class first semester may not be able to continue in that class; additionally they will need to repeat that class in the summer before returning to Bishop High School. The Cal States and UC's will not accept D's in college prep classes. So, it is suggested that these courses be re-taken in the summer as well. See your academic counselor for more information about how to sign up for online or off-campus courses, which will require an approved BGDHS Academic Petition.

Counseling Intern:

Joining us in December is Mrs. Stacey Mitchell, from Adam State University. Stacey will complete her Counseling Credential Internship with us at Bishop, as she gears up for her comprehensive exams in May. Mrs. Mitchell recently finished her internship hours at Vandenberg Middle School and Buellton Elementary. She has worked as an aide for Special Education in Carpinteria Unified and has a background in supporting nonprofit organizations. Welcome Mrs. Mitchell!

College Planning:

College applications due by January 9th that require a counselor recommendation and/or transcript should be given to counselors by December 2nd.

9th, 10th, and 11th grade students will receive their

PSAT results soon, along with some information on how to interpret them. When taken in 11th grade, the PSAT is an indication of how a student will score on the SAT. It is crucial that students look at the areas where they need the most work and concentrate on improving performance in the months ahead.

The California Scholarship Federation is an academic based association for sophomores through seniors with a 3.5 GPA or higher. Students must meet requirements each semester, fill out an application, and pay \$4.00 in dues. Students should make a copy of their report card and bring it to Mrs. Hornbuckle when they pick up their application in January.

Financial Aid Night will be held at Bishop on Wednesday, January 11th from 4:00pm-8:00pm. This workshop will cover financial aid applications, loans, grants, and scholarships for two and four year schools. Parents and students will also have the opportunity to complete their FAFSA with financial aid experts. This workshop is open to all students and parents; however it is geared for parents who have seniors. A presentation will take place in both English and Spanish. More information regarding our financial aid night will be included in the January newsletter.

Parents of Senior Students - The filing period to begin the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 2011-2012 school year begins January 1, 2012. It is strongly encouraged that you file your 2011 income tax return as soon as possible so you can complete this form.

The Scholarship Foundation of Santa Barbara awards more than \$5 million in scholarships to local students. Forms should be completed online at http://www.sbscholarship.org/students/loan_apply/index.html. The deadline to apply is January 31, 2012.

ARE YOUR STUDENTS GETTING ENOUGH SLEEP?

Teenagers on average are getting two hours less than the 9 ½ recommended by experts, according to a National Sleep Foundation Poll.

Not only may your son or daughter be difficult to get out of bed in the morning and “out of sorts” with the rest of the family when sleep deprived, research reports indicate the following concerns about the critical importance of sleep for teens:

- During teenage sleep major brain construction is going on; critical new circuitry is being made especially in the frontal lobes.
- Sleep strengthens what has been learned.
- Sleep protects, strengthens and assists

in the growth of the brain.

- The brain uses sleep to organize information acquired during the day; sorts what is to be stored in long term memory.
- There is also evidence that insufficient sleep is related to Attention Deficit Disorder, overeating and obesity.

Parents and guardians can help their teens’ brain development by setting firm bedtimes, banning technology from their bedrooms and/or placing strict limits on their use after a certain hour. A teenager’s cognitive future may depend on it! (One study found that teenagers send an average of 34 texts after going to bed.)

DRESS CODE PROTOCOL

Winter has arrived, please be sure your son and/or daughter is dressed appropriately for the weather change; keep warm, stay healthy. A reminder **Thursday, December 8th** is the Senior Mothers' Mass. **Mass dress is required and will be enforced.** Please take time to review the school's dress code protocol.

1st offense = Meeting with Dean of Men/Women and Loaner Clothing provided (if available); note made in school file.

For **MALE** students, if something that can be covered up with a jacket, sweater, or sweatshirt, the student is to go take off the offending undershirt so that they can't unzip or open the over shirt later in the day.

For **FEMALE** students with the same situation, they are simply to wear the loaner clothing or are sent home or have a parent bring clothing.

2nd offense = Parent notified; student sent home to change or parent can bring clothing; note made in school file.

3rd offense = Student sent home to change or parent can bring clothing; parent conference; note made in school file.

4th offense = Student sent home to change, or parent can bring clothing; parent conference and discipline contract; note made in school file.
